In September, Lions Solomon and John attended R.L.L.I, a three-day event at Camp Dogwood. Each of the five Lion districts of North Carolina were instructed to send five club members to the event which focused on their preparation to become leaders in their districts.

The Regional Lions Leadership Institute is designed to accomplish the following objectives:

Encourage club members to pursue leadership roles within their Lions communities.

Familiarize club leaders with the operations, issues, and opportunities of their clubs.

Promote leadership skills critical to the success of their position.

Foster a deeper understanding of how to better serve clubs.

Twenty-six Lions from NC signed up for the event and twenty-two were able to attend. Courses included: Diversity, Lions Fundamentals, Leadership Responsibilities and Expectations, Member Motivation, Goal Setting, Personal Mission Statement, Public Speaking, and Working in Teams.

The group left excited and enthusiastic to use their new skills within their clubs and districts. It is anticipated that the Leadership Institute will again be made available in Spring of 2023.

Taylor is an employee of a firm in Apex that contracts with schools to provide needed services to visually impaired students. They also provide assistance to deaf and hard of hearing students. From their website, we found they support children with visual impairments and blindness in school, home and community settings with highly qualified Teachers of the Visually Impaired, Orientation and Mobility Specialists and Braillists. Taylor uses her own experiences of being blind to assist the children with which she works.

Vision Screening Update

Although we were going to do a presentation about our vision screening program to the Kannapolis Rotary Club, we've been postponed until Tuesday, October 12th. Stay tuned for more news about this!

In the meantime, we have some exciting news. We are in the process of setting up a partnership with the Concord Lake STEAM Academy in Kannapolis to provide eye screenings for their students. Katie McDaniel, the school nurse at Concord Lake, said it has been a couple of years since their students have been

tested. The school has about 554 students from grades K through 8. For now we are being asked to test grades K through 5 (about 450 students). Because of a number of circumstances, she has asked for the testing to be done in February 2022. We'll be working out the logistics in November so that we can be prepared to provide our services. Finally, we would like to do a training session so that we will have more eye screeners certified by Lions KidSight USA. We have some people who have already volunteered to be screeners who need to be certified but if anyone else in the club is interested, please let either John Nunn or Kathy Poirier know. The training date is TBD.
